- We require only that you bring an open heart and an open mind, as we grow as Christians on campus.

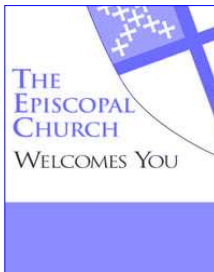
## Caring Community

Canterbury Fellowship offers home-cooked meals and a place to be yourself as an inquiring Christian. We meet at St. Alban's Episcopal Church, a place of acceptance and welcome, usually on Wednesday night and Sunday nights. We care about students and their faith, and offer prayer and support through the ups and downs of campus life. There is a labyrinth on the grounds of the church for meditative walking. The chaplain is available on campus one day a week for chats and coffee with students, or at any time, by cell phone, for pastoral care.
